Dear Parents

It is very sad that the whole world is anxious about the outbreak of COVID - 19 or coronavirus which keeps evolving at a dizzying speed. The World Health Organization has declared the outbreak of the virus a global pandemic as cases are rising. More than 121 000 people have been infected, and there are at least 4 383 global deaths. Although no major outbreaks have occurred in some countries, there is no doubt that more countries will soon see the spread of the virus. Countries are taking measures to slow down the spread of COVID – 19. One major way that is being used is increased social distancing that has resulted in closure of schools, universities and playing sports in empty stadia.

SYMPTOMS

According to information currently being provided, the common symptoms are fever and a dry cough. Some symptoms resemble a cold, that is stuffy nose, runny nose and sneezing.

HOW IS THE CORONAVIRUS SPREAD?

It is spread when an infected person sneezes and let out a spray. If the droplets reach the nose, mouth or eyes of another person that could lead to an infection. It has also been found that in rare cases one can catch the disease by touching droplets on surfaces and then touch membranes in the mouth, eyes and nose. Further investigations will reveal more.



PROTECTIVE MEASURES

THE FOLLOWING MEASURES HAVE BEEN RECOMMENDED:

We are encouraged to practice good hand hygiene. We are urged to wash our hands frequently with soap and water or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer. We should cover our coughs and sneezes with the inside of our elbow or upper arm. We are also encouraged to avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth. There is also need to avoid contact with people who are sick. We must clean and disinfect commonly touched surfaces frequently. When one is sick, he/she is urged to stay at home. Sadly, the outbreak calls for social distances. Lets all keep on doing our part to keep our community health.
